Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Can I use these funds to pay for my Basic Communications Officer Training Course if needed?

No, the training must be related to NG911.

Is there a match requirement for the grant?

No, your PSAP does not need to provide a match.

When is the last day I can submit training?

January 31, 2022 is the last day to submit your training for reimbursement.

What if I am interested in taking courses not offered by NENA or APCO?

In this case, you can submit course information to the Training Committee, and direct questions to 911grants@gema.ga.gov.

How much money am I getting?

\$10,000

I'm a secondary PSAP, am I eligible for grant funding?

No, this grant applies to primary PSAPs only.

If I don't spend all of the \$10,000, do I get to keep the rest?

No.

I don't foresee being able to use the full \$10,000, what should I do?

Contact 911grants@gema.ga.gov to confirm the lapse, and the funds can be diverted to another PSAP.

Is this a multiyear grant?

No, this grant will end in 2022.

I have a large amount of employees in my center, are we eligible for more money than what is allotted?

No, each PSAP has access to \$10,000.

Can I use these funds for recertification?

No.

Can I purchase NENA or APCO memberships using these funds?

No.

What documents are required to provide when applying for reimbursement?

- Invoices/Receipts (whichever is applicable)
- Cancelled Check Copies
- Debit Card Transactions, ACH or EFT Proofs (bank statement)
- Credit Card Transactions *All credit card statements require proof of debt settlement (e.g., cancelled check copy, ACH or EFT transactions reflected on bank statement, or subsequent month's statement that shows that the debt was paid/settled)
