TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

GEMA/HS is just one source of support and technical assistance related to school safety. Local emergency management agencies, local law enforcement offices, school resource officers, private consulting firms and

the Georgia Department of Education also provide valuable assistance to schools as they develop their safety planning.

Technical assistance includes, but is not limited to:

- Bomb threat management
- Exercise design
- Model school safety plans
- STAR audits
- Safe school planning
- Site surveys

TRAINING

School safety training for the state's education, emergency management and public safety networks is also provided by GEMA/HS. Training on school safety is provided through a series of statewide conferences, regional workshops and presentations provided at the request of local communities.
