Why are reporting numbers different?

In order for DPH to report a COVID-19 case or death, the case must be confirmed by the department through testing or postmortem examination. It is a necessary step in ensuring that the information released is accurate. The biggest current lag in reporting is providers receiving results and reporting them to the state, as the state does not directly receive many of the test results. Any private provider who orders a test receives the results and then must report them to the Department of Public Health since COVID-19 is now a reportable disease.



Quarantine vs Isolation

While you may have heard these terms used interchangeably, they mean very different things. Quarantine is what happens when a person is not sick, who has **NOT** tested positive for the virus, separates hin/herself by staying home or sheltering in place.

When a person has tested positive for COVID-19, whether they are well or sick, but do not need to be hospitalized, is placed in isolation, or should isolate from other household members and not go out into the public for any reason.

How to protect pets if you are sick

If you are sick with COVID-19 (either suspected or confirmed), you should restrict contact with pets and other animals, just like you would around other people. Although there have not been reports of pets or other animals becoming sick with COVID-19, it is still recommended that people sick with COVID-19 limit contact with animals until more information is known about the virus. When possible, have another member of your household care for your animals while you are sick. Avoid contact with your pet including, petting, snuggling, being kissed or licked, and sharing food. If you must care for your pet or be around animals while you are sick, wash your hands before and after you interact with them.





Caring for Someone at Home with COVID-19

Most people who get sick with COVID-19 will have only mild illness and should recover at home. Care at home can help stop the spread of COVID-19. If you are caring for someone at home, monitor for emergency signs, prevent the spread of germs, treat symptoms, and carefully consider when to end home isolation.

If you develop emergency warning signs, get medical attention immediately. Emergency warning signs include*:

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion or inability to arouse
- Bluish lips or face















Governor Kemp stated that this facility will not only be used for COVID-19 response, but will also serve as a valuable resource for future incidents in the State of Georgia.







GEMA/HS & DPH Distribute Largest PPE Shipment to Date

Governor Brian P. Kemp announced that the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency (GEMA/HS) and the Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) distributed the largest shipment of personal protective equipment (PPE) to date.

More than 600 orders, equaling 150 pallets of PPE and supplies, left the DPH warehouse bound for hospitals, healthcare facilities, and test sites throughout the State. Additionally, the team delivered four urgent PPE resupplies to the Georgia Department of Agriculture, the CVS Test Site at Georgia Tech, and the Georgia Department of Corrections. The shipment yesterday totaled 38,420 face shields, 423,000 gloves, 432,150 surgical masks, and 81,120 coveralls to frontline healthcare workers.












